AFFIDAVIT OF PHILIP PRICE

- I, Philip Price, of the City of Kitchener, in the Province of Ontario, MAKE OATH AND SAY:
- 1. I have two children, aged 3 and 4.5, who attend and attended the Duke Street Childcare Centre operated by the YWCA Kitchener-Waterloo, which operates across the street from the Consumption and Treatment Site (the "CTS") located at 150 Duke Street West, Kitchener.

2. As such I have knowledge of the matters contained in this affidavit. Where I do not have direct knowledge of a matter, I have stated the source of my information and belief and verily believe that information to be true.

A. The Neighborhood before the CTS Opened

- 3. From 2016 to 2024 I lived in downtown Kitchener and would often walk my children to daycare, occasionally walking near the CTS. My oldest son is now in kindergarten, but my younger son still attends the Duke Street Childcare Centre located at 111 Duke Street West, Kitchener. The daycare often takes the children out for walks around the neighbourhood and they walk near the CTS.
- 4. I work at City Hall which is located at 200 King Street West, Kitchener, approximately 62 meters from the CTS. The windows of my office look out onto the CTS. The Duke Street Childcare Centre is located on the second floor of Kitchener City Hall.
- 5. Prior to the CTS opening, I noticed street-involved people in this area of Kitchener. During my work day, I would regularly see people passed out and slumped over in and around City Hall.
- 6. In late 2018, before the opening of the CTS, there was an overdose right outside my office. A paramedic tried to resuscitate the person, but I'm not sure the person survived. Witnessing this overdose was a traumatic and stressful experience for me.

B. Opening of the CTS in 2019

7. The opening of the CTS eased some of my concerns regarding overdoses in the area.

- 8. I have noticed a marked decrease in the amount of interaction I have observed between City Hall security guards and street involved people since the CTS opened.
- 9. Since the CTS has opened, I've never observed police there. I've seen police and Emergency Medical Services at the neighbouring church at 23 Water Street North, Kitchener, but never at the CTS.
- 10. I have never seen open drug use outside the CTS.
- 11. The presence of the CTS has put me at ease. It's made me feel good about my children's experience at their daycare. With the CTS open, I know that overdoses are being prevented and that people are using drugs more safely than before. I have never seen discarded needles near or around the CTS. I feel more comfortable when the daycare takes the children out on walks knowing that the CTS is offering the services it does.
- 12. I have never once heard any concerns about the CTS from the daycare staff or any parents of any children at the daycare.

C. Conclusion

- 13. The neighbourhood has improved since the CTS has opened.
- 14. If the CTS were to close, I would worry about the safety of my children in the area. I would also worry about the safety of those who attend the CTS. The CTS has made me feel more comfortable, knowing that overdoses are being prevented and that people are using safely.
- 15. On September 25, 2024, the Regional Municipality of Waterloo Council passed a motion urging the Ontario government to continue funding the CTS beyond the proposed termination date

date of March 2025. Attached hereto and marked as Exhibit "A" to my affidavit are excerpts from the Sentember 25, 2024. Council Minutes that relate to this issue. Similarly, on October 1, 2024, the City of Kitchener Council passed a similar motion asking the Ontario government to continue to permit the operation and funding of the Kitchener CTS. Attached hereto and marked as Exhibit "B" to my affidavit are excerpts from the October 1, 2024, Council Minutes that relate to this issue. I support both of these motions by my municipal officials and hope that our CTS can continue to operate.

15. I affirm this affidavit in support of the Applicant's application and for no further or other purpose.

WHEREAS the daycare across the street from the Consumption and

Treatment Services site suggests the neighbourhood is better off since the facility opened; and,

WHEREAS closing Consumption and Treatment Services site is expected to cause deaths and other harms, increased drug use in public spaces; and,

WHEREAS the closure of the Kitchener site will place additional strain on emergency services, staff of area non-profit agencies, and the healthcare system; and,

WHEREAS the Consumption and Treatment Services site provides a range of health, medical, and social services, not accessible elsewhere; and,

WHEREAS healthcare should emphasize prevention, harm reduction as well as treatment, including voluntary, evidence-based addiction treatment on demand;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City of Kitchener Council urges the Ontario government to continue to permit the operation and funding of the Kitchener CTS, subject to the agreement of the City of Kitchener and the Region of Waterloo, as well as funding all currently operating Consumption and Treatment Sites beyond the proposed termination date in March 2025;
